Luis Arcentales is a Shanghai-based economist with nearly two decades of experience specializing in Latin America. Until 2020, he served as a Senior Economist and Executive Director at Morgan Stanley in New York, where he held the position of co-head of Latin America Economics for a few years. His main focus was developing the macroeconomic and political outlooks for Mexico, Chile and Peru, in addition to publishing extensively on topics ranging from the business cycle to trade and fiscal dynamics for the region. Since joining Morgan Stanley in 2001, the Latin America group earned the first place as Wall Street's top economics team in the annual Institutional Investor (II) survey 11 times; Luis has been frequently cited in the financial press and presented his views in several conferences. Prior to moving to New York, Luis was an equity strategist at McGlinn Capital, an asset manager in Pennsylvania. He holds a master's in economics and a bachelor's in industrial engineering from Lehigh University, and he is a CFA charter holder
