Disruption Risk is expected to increase
substantially in the 2nd Quarter 2022
and is the number one concern for
supply chain professionals. Interestingly,
with a score of 89.5, Transportation
Disruption Risk has the highest risk
index across all risk categories since the
creation of the LRMI. There seems to be
greater worries about fuel prices, driver

shortage, infrastructure and demand volatility.
